**PHARMACOLOGICAL ACTION :** Paracetamol also acts in the brain to reduce fever. Ibuprofen belongs to a family of medicines called non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs). This group of medicines work by relieving pain, inflammation (swelling, redness, soreness) and fever.

**USED FOR :** IBUTAMOL tablets contains two ingredients paracetamol and ibuprofen that together deliver temporary relief of acute (short term) pain and or inflammation associated with headache, migraine headache, tension headache, sinus pain, toothache, dental procedures, backache, muscular aches and pains, period pain, sore throat, ...

**SIDE EFFECTS :** Constipation.

- Heartburn.
- Abdominal pain.
- Drowsiness.
- Diarrhoea.
- Epigastric Pain.
- Anaphylactic Reaction.
